 5th and today, and was unable to get any answer. I then called a next door neighbor, Mr.  
 STON and talked to him. He advised me that Mrs. MORAN had left to go to RUSSIA on 7-11-82,  
 nd that he had driven her car to Dallas. However, he describes the car as a Grand Prix, light  
 ue in color. He does not know anything about a white '79 Pontiac that she might have.

At 8:55 A.M., 7-15-82, I received information from Mr. JIM FOLEY, who is the owner of the PAWA A-1, at 1920 W. Waco Drive. He informed me that on Tuesday, before lunch, 7-13-82, a WF party to forty years of age, having long black hair with a red bandana on her head, wearing high top moccasin boots, had a knife stuck in her boots, had rotten teeth in front and hippy dressed. He stated that this woman came in and tried to sell him a Minolta camera, and that the boy that was with her, appeared to resemble the appearance of KEN FRANKS, compared with the picture in the newspaper. He had also stated that they had gotten into an orange looking small compact car, and had left the scene after he had inquired about a drivers license, before he could buy the camera.

Due to the time of day that the girls were supposed to have left WAXAHACHIE on 7-13-82, I feel like this woman was not a companion of KEN FRANKS, in that vehicle, being that the girls left WAXAHACHIE after 12:00 P.M., and it would have taken them about an hour and a half to reach Waco.

At 9:30 A.M., 7-15-82, I received a call from Mr. JOHN OLDIG of phone 753-1791. He stated that on Monday evening, 7-12-82, he had been run off the road by two white males driving very fast on the street, in a '77 Chevrolet. He stated that he had copied the license number down, and gave it to the Police Sergeant at the desk, and that the SERGEANT had made the comment that he had received several calls on this vehicle. Mr. OLDIG also stated that the car had come back registered to '77 Chevrolet, of some local address in the City. He gave me the license number YZY 416. I did run this number through, and it came back registered to a '78 Chevrolet stationwagon, to an EXPORT COMPANY in EL PASO. Apparently, Mr. OLDIG had given me the wrong license number on this vehicle.

At 9:42 A.M., I was contacted by JIM DORSETT of 776-1985. He stated that he had seen a Chevrolet pickup, which was gold on top, cream in the middle and gold on the bottom, sort of a blue tone color, with mag wheels and white tires, with a WM subject 18 to 21 years of age, clean cut with sandy brown hair, and that the subject was acting suspicious, near the harbor in EGGLEVILLE. He stated that he did not take a license plate number on the pickup, as he did not have time to. However, he stated that the subject was starting to walk back down to the

where the boats are docked, and that when he had seen Mr. DORSETT and his boy, he had seen about face, got in his truck and left for no apparent reason. I did ask him if he saw pickup again, to try to obtain an LP on it, so we could check out who this subject is.

9:20 A.M., received information from dispatcher, that an unknown female caller had given information on a DANNY SIZEMORE. The caller stated that this subject had bought dope from the team, and had also made statements to the caller that he had killed people before. I was unable to get any kind of record on DANNY SIZEMORE from our department. They described this subject to be approximately 17 to 18 years of age.

10:15 A.M., 7-15-82, I received a call from Captain SULLINS of the Waxahachie Police Department. He stated to me that JILL MONTGOMERY had in her possession, a credit card from the OIL COMPANY which was made out to her grandfather, PHIL E. MARALLI, and that she would have this in her possession for gas, in her purse or somewhere. As of this time, I have not located the card, nor have we heard any information that the card might have been used. Also, Captain SULLINS stated that a caseworker from the METHODIST HOME, Ms. BELLEHIMER, who had been a caseworker for JILL MONTGOMER, and also for KEN FRANKS, and that they had received information that FRANKS was dealing in dope, and that JILL had liked a boy by the name of RANDY from METHODIST HOME. However, they did not have a last name on this subject.

Captain SULLINS also stated to me that a ROBERT J. McSWAIN, WM, 07-15-63, BRN/BLUE, 6', 150, clean shaven, had been handled by their Police Department for Assault & Public Intoxication. He said that this subject does come from ORLANDO, FLORIDA, and approximately two weeks ago, had made threats toward JILL of bodily harm. However, he has not contacted anyone who has positive information on this threat, or why the threat was made. Also received information from JILL's statements, that she was supposed to have met a new speed freak here in Waco. No further information from Waxahachie.

11:35 A.M., I made contact with the general manager of the BRAZOS LANDING, which is where TORRES works with a personal friend of KEN FRANKS. Mr. DOUGLAS COMALLI, stated that on a day night at approximately 10:00 P.M., he saw KEN FRANKS at the BRAZOS LANDING, waiting for

PAT to get off work . He also stated that about this same time, he had seen another employee named DONNIE CULP of 1924 Tanglewood Drive, to be waiting for PAT to get off work also. However, the two people that were waiting for PAT TORRES, were not together. I did ask Mr. MALLI, if he had seen KEN FRANKS get in any kind of car, with either of those two subjects, and he stated that he had not. He did state, that Wednesday, 7-15-82, that PAT TORRES had asked to get off early, around 6:30 or 7:00 P.M., that he had business to take care of.

Detective NICOLETTI did check on the story from PAT TORRES and DONNIE CULP, where DONNIE CULP stated that he had been waiting for PAT TORRES Tuesday night. However, he had not seen KEN FRANKS at that location. (SEE DETECTIVE NICOLETTI'S FORM 3 FOR THIS INFORMATION)

On 7-16-82, at 9:10 A.M., I received information from a KENNETH ADKINSON of 1115 Jefferson, Room #105. This subject is an ex-METHODIST HOME resident, 18 years of age. He volunteered information to me, and told me that he knew JILL MONTGOMERY from the Methodist Home. He also stated that he had dated her several times, and that nothing had really come out of the dating just a friendly going out together. He also stated that he knew KENNETH also from the home, and that KENNETH had left the home in September of 1981. He also stated that he did not believe that JILL had gotten in a car with anybody and left, being that she did not trust anybody, and would not get into anybody's car unless she knew them. ADKINSON also stated that he knew that FRANKS was involved in drugs, and took speed and smoked a lot of grass. He stated that FRANKS got most of his contraband from black kids at Waco High. He also stated that FRANKS had been released from the home for sexually harassing girls in the Methodist Home. He further stated that JILL did not like drugs. However, she drank some, but not much at that. I did ask ADKINSON if he knew KEN FRANKS real well, and asked if he could defend himself if he had to. ADKINSON said that he knew KEN knew a little karate, enough to defend himself, being that he had told him at the home that he had learned the karate from his father, who had been in the service previously.

ADKINSON said that he saw KEN approximately two weeks ago, on Valley Mills Drive, and he had seen JILL approximately three months ago, at the Methodist Home. He stated that KEN FRANKS had a habit of grass, anywhere from \$80.00 to \$150.00 a week. That they were paying anywhere from

anywhere from \$80.00 to \$120.00 an ounce on grass, and that KEN FRANKS would smoke or give anywhere from one to two ounces per week. He stated that he had gotten mad at a subject one day, being that they were on Valley Mills, and a subject had come up to them in a green Chevrolet pickup, about a '67 model with mojac wheels, sort of half way customized. He stated that the subject driving the truck was white male, approximately 24 or 25 years of age, blond bushy hair, mustache and muscular build. Also, that he was approximately 6' to 6'2" & 200 pounds. The subject had told KEN FRANKS that if he did not pay him the \$150.00 that he owed him, that he was going to get him taken care of. This was approximately two months ago at JACK'S STER

He also stated to me that he would keep his ears open around KOEHNE PARK, and that he would give me any information that that he knew could be helpful to this investigation. He also stated that kids in KOEHNE PARK wanted to have a party at 10:00 P.M. Saturday night, 7-17-82 and that he would keep his ears open to see if anything transpired from this. He also stated that the subject that was going to have the party at 10:00 P.M., 7-17-82, was a DANNY ORSAK, WM, age 19, who drives a dirty white stationwagon., and would be selling crystal meth, near beach area of KOEHNE PARK, which is to the right of the entrance.

At 9:45 A.M., 7-16-82, I received information from a SCOTT JOHNSON of 740 Westivew, Apt. #36 phone 776-2595. He stated that he had been at KOEHNE PARK at approximately 6:30 P.M., on 7-13-82, and that his girlfriend, SHELLY WHITE, age 20, who lives with him at the same address above, had come looking for him at KOEHNE PARK, and that she remembers seeing the orange car at the Circle of the KOEHNE PARK, and that she had mentioned something about the boots on a park bench. However, he had not noticed them when he had gone over there, and made a turn with his friend. I then asked him to have her to call me directly, where I could question her in reference to what she had seen at this location.

This date, 7-17-82 at 9:20 A.M., I made contact with SHELLY WHITE at her place of employment -5438, which is FAMILY FINANCE COMPANY, where I talked to her about this matter. She stated that at approximately 7:30 P.M., she had gone to KOEHNE PARK looking for SCOTT, and that she had seen the orange car at the Circle, and that she had also seen the boots and tennis shoes on the park bench to the left of it. She said that she did not think much of it at that time.

However, around 9:00 or 9:30 P.M., about dark, she had gone by the Circle again and noticed the shoes and the car there again. She stated at this time that she was going to call the police, if she saw this car there any longer after that, and she had not returned. At 9:30 P.M., when she did go by there, she stated that she only saw the orange car, with no one around it. During the time she had gone there at 7:30 P.M., she had seen a red car and a white pickup, parked in the Circle, not specifically near the orange car.

She stated that Wednesday morning around 10:30 A.M., she had gone back to the park, and had noticed that nobody was there at the park, but just the vehicle, and that night she had heard that the kids had been found, and that the car belonged to them.

She stated that herself, and a subject by the name of RICK, had talked to a guy who was acting weird at the park, and was driving a gray van. She said this subject identified himself as coming from Fort Worth, and would be going back within the next two or three days. This subject is described as being in his late 20's, 5'11", slender build, 150 pounds, wearing blue cutoffs and a Hawaiian shirt. He had bushy brown hair, and wore dark sunglasses. She stated that RICK talked to the guy for several minutes, trying to find out about him, being that he had never seen the man before, and was a little older than the crowd that normally hangs out at KOEHNE PARK. She is to have him call me back and give me the information as to who, or what the guy might have said.

I have received several leads, or several calls of information from different people into this matter, and Detective NICOLETTI and myself are trying to check all leads as they come in. On 7-16-82, at approximately 10:30 A.M., we received information of an unidentified caller who talked to Detective NICOLETTI, and mentioned the name of TAB HARPER, who is a known police character with the Police Department, having PD#10334. The caller stated that this subject might have been the one who had committed the offense, that they had seen him near the victim's car, in a blue van, and had also seen another subject standing by with HARPER. This would be at approximately 9:00 or 9:30 P.M., 7-13-82. Detective NICOLETTI and myself then went by 2725 Clay at approximately 12:30 or 1:00 P.M., and picked up HARPER and brought him to the Police Department to talk to him about the incident. He was taken by Judge JOE JOHNSON's office who

he was warned of his rights at 1:45 P.M., after having to wait for the Judge for a while to get to his office. After the warning was administered, the Judge ran down the information of an autopsy from the Dallas Institute, where I had Detective NICOLETTI stand by outside with TAB HARPER. After the rundown was done, Judge JOHNSON received a call from a known informant, who stated that he information from some kids, that a TAB HARPER had done the killing, and that he was trying to find the eyewitness who had seen it, and that TAB HARPER had threatened the young girl who was our witness, that she would be dead withing 24 hours if she told on him.

I then went to Valley Mills & Bosque, where I did talk with the informant who had called Judge JOHNSON. He told me that his nephew had been at a school, and that a girl by the name of LEIGH ANNE, at the school, had mentioned that her girlfriend had seen TERRY HARPER kill those kids, and that she had been threatened with death. I did call the informant's nephew personally where he told me the same thing. He also stated that LEIGH ANNE, whose last name he did not know, was in Summer School at UNIVERSITY HIGH SCHOOL, and that I could get her name from the records there.

DETECTIVE NICOLETTI and myself had received information similar to this, earlier that morning from an unknown male caller. Therefore, I made contact with Mr. JAY McCULLOUGH, Principal of the Summer School at UNIVERSITY HIGH SCHOOL, where he gave me the name of the girl named LEIGH ANNE, found to be HOGELAND of 1420 Guthrie, home phone 776-2024, age 16, DOB: 07-31-65. At 1:45 P.M., I had an interview with Ms. HOGELAND, where I asked her for the information that she had been giving around at school, and she told me that she had not made any comments pertaining to what I told her the two callers had told us that she had said. She stood by her ground, and would not budge from that. She stated that she had not called anybody, and that the only thing that she knows about HARPER, was that some of the kids around JACK'S STEREO and KOEHNE PARK, had said that he was the one who was capable of doing something like this.

She also told me at this time, that she knew of another friend of her's, who might have some information for me into this, being a JOHN LANDERS of 756-3952, who works at the printing shop at HILLCREST HOSPITAL. I did call Mr. LANDERS. However, he stated that he did not know anything specifically, but that he would try to contact another friend of his to call me about soon.

pecifics. However, he had not done so at this time.

At 4:40 P.M., 7-16-82, I received a call from MELINDA WELLS of 756-5677. She told me that she went to the Circle at KOEHNE PARK, and that she was riding with a friend that she did not wish to identify, and she stated that she saw KEN FRANKS and the girls near an orange Pinto about 11:00 P.M., 7-13-82. She also said that there was a white van and a white car, not specifically near the orange Pinto. She stated that about that time of night there was not much traffic at that location. I did ask her to give me information as to what type of clothing the young subject was wearing, that she identified as FRANKS, from the pictures in the paper. She told me that she did not know what the subject was wearing, only that he had on blue jeans and tennis shoes. I did ask her to talk to her friend that was with her that night, to see if he had seen anything, and for her to call me back to ascertain if they had indeed seen KEN FRANKS, since she was asking for identification on the clothing that the subject was had on when they saw him in this orange car. She has not called me as of this time, yet.

As of this time, this is all the information and leads that we have, However, we are checking out every lead and every call that are coming into our department. Every call that has come in, has been documented with time, date and possible name, if the caller wishes to be identified.
